#### University of British Columbia



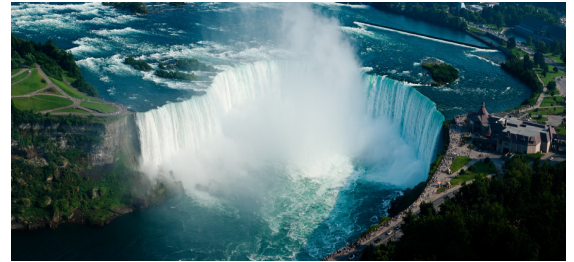

### New Double Degree for master students in Banking & Finance

Stockholm University School of Business has signed an agreement with the University of Ljubljana, Faculty of Economics for a Double Degree program in Banking and Finance & Economics. The degree will lead to the award of a Master of Science with a specialization in Banking and Finance from Stockholm University and a Master in Economics from the University of Ljubljana. Students enrolled in the master program in Banking and Finance are eligible to apply starting in the fall of 2012.
